#### MINUTES of the JANUARY 5, 2011

#### General Membership Meeting

Meeting came to order, 7:40 p.m., Louisa Carey presiding.

Pledge of Allegiance led by Jack Lewis.

Hospitality: Seventeen members attending, and four (4) guests: Amber and Arion, Cindy and Bella.

Carol presented Louisa with a bike helmet packed with bubble wrap (a reminder that safety comes first when riding a bike, digging for rocks, working in the shop, etc!)

Scholarships: Kay Hara presented Amber MacCaulay with a scholarship and certificate from OGMS. Amber is a

student at Oxnard Junior College, and a member of the Student Council.

Amber thanked the OGMS for the scholarship, which will go towards her continuing education.

Programs: First VP Brett Johnson introduced Jim Brace-Thompson, newly elected President of the California Federation. Each year, the President chooses a theme for the year's activities. Last year, the theme was "Grow the Federation", encouraging members to bring friends and relatives into the hobby. This year, Jim has chosen to embrace the theme "Year of the Child", as a way to introduce children and young people to the hobby and continue to bring new members into the Federation.

Jim has been Chair of Youth Activities for the past few years, so this is a natural progression for him as President. He is inviting children and youth to participate and pursue the hobby of rock collecting and to get interested in geology through badge programs, and fun activities at meetings. Jim mentioned that Donna Knapton has done a great job with the Education Committee for the OGMS and the Tri-County Education Committee.

He has also promised to present any youth displayers at the county fair with awards. This may cost him a pretty penny if all the youths in the Tri-County area take him up on it! The Ventura Gem & Mineral Show event runs March 5th and 6th, at the VC Fairgrounds, Seaside Park.

Jim and Nancy presented a 5-minute slide show of kids at shows, schools, presentations, and rock hunting. The idea is to have activities aimed at kids and a leader. OGMS will kick off this activity schedule with the February 2nd meeting, at 6:00 pm. Louisa Carey will have the pleasure of conducting the youth class, prior to the General Meeting. Louisa spoke about the badge program, and the 45-minute classes. There was some discussion on what the monthly meetings could include and whether once a month is sufficient. Activities should be planned to accommodate ages 3 or 4 to age 18.

Brett Johnson discusses the Tri-County Education Committee, comprised of Ventura, Oxnard, and Conejo Valley Gem & Mineral Societies. The committee donated earth science books to all grade schools and county libraries in the area. One set is missing an Earth Science book, and the committee is asking anyone who has an extra one to donate it back to the committee so they can complete their delivery to the eight city libraries.

The committee is looking into DVD's based on Science Channel shows and Discovery Channel programming, for donation to the schools in 2011. These could be checked out by teachers for their classes in science and geography.

Stephanie Hagiwara told us about the history of Durlly Park, where our lapidary and silversmithing shop is located. It seems that the new Measure "O" funds may now be spent for parks and recreation, and there are about \$2M in funds waiting for appropriation. Stephanie wondered if the members of OGMS are interested in pursuing the city funds for the refurbishment or rebuild of our classrooms. The City Council is anxious for feedback from the various programs, and we have the opportunity to expand our classes with this money.

### **Durly Park History**

From the presentation by: Mark Turek at the City of Oxnard Parks and Recreation Commission Agenda December 8, 2010.

W. Mark Durly Community Park's original opening date was October 28, 1960. It is believed the "W" stood for Williamson. Durly was an early Oxnard attorney. He represented local farmers and ranchers in Oxnard and Camarillo.

The park was adjacent to a Sewer Plant. In 1963, the four acres comprising the Sewer Plant land was added as a hilly area to the original seven acres of the park. The original tanks, covered with dirt and grass, are still there. The city has been applying for grants for the tank removals.

Some interesting facts: There was a firing range somewhere on the other side of the snack bar area. In 1965, the YMCA ran a youth program for one year at the center building.

In 1980, Durly Park benefited from a Federal Urban Park Grant for \$140,000 with \$60,000 city funding to restore the 3 buildings, add the basketball court with night lighting, created parking, and converted an old restroom to park storage. In 1981, a Federal Community Block Grant for \$89,000 was used for updating the irrigation system and a new backstop for Sunset Little League.

A re-dedication ceremony was held April 7, 1984. It featured demonstrations by the Oxnard Gem & Mineral Society, karate students, youth basketball players, and players from the Sunset Little League.

**Field trip Location:** Our field trip will be to the Santa Monica Mtns. We will be going to 3 sites **Agoura/Kanan Rd. Sites 1 & 2** for agate-saginite & plume, marcacite, chalcedony. There are several ravines, rock outcroppings. Light to moderate hike, getting harder the more you go uphill. Light to moderate brush covers the mountain.

**Malibu/Piuma Rd. Site 3** for scallop fossils, large and small. They can be found along the base of the hill, the better specimens are up on the hill. It's a moderate/steep hike up the hill where you will find the scallop fossils in the rocks and on the ground. There can be sticky stickers, I'd recommend long pants, long sleeves, gloves

**Directions:** Look for a CFMS sign on my white F-250 Ford Pickup 4x crew cab. Agoura and Malibu sites are between Thousand Oaks, and the San Frenando Valley, off the 101 Freeway. Kanan Road is 3.2 miles to Las Virgenes Road/Malibu rd. Agoura/Kanan Rd (9am-1pm). Exit Kanan Rd. Head south towards mountains/beach. Drive 1.7 miles on Kanan Road to a large pullout on Right (North) side of the road Malibu/Piuma Rd. (1:30pm-) Exit Las Virgenes Road head South, towards the ocean. Drive .2 miles to the intersection of Agoura Road, keep on Las Virgenes Road/Malibu Road 4.5 miles. To Piuma Road, turn Left, East, go 6.1 miles up a winding road to the top, along the crest, then go down on the other side, (ocean side) Park on left side of road, in large pullout. There are many vistas view on the drive, don't forget to bring your camera. [MAP](#)

**Meeting:** Saturday Afternoon, Feb 26th, 9am. We will meet at the Kanan site. We will be there for 4 hours at the 2 Kanan sites. At 1pm we will head to the Malibu/Piuma site. There will be a short briefing of the sites. Please remember to sign the release form to participate in the field trip. These are easy accesses, but moderate climbs, you might find fragments along the base of the hills, but the best specimens are found up on the hill.

**Tools:** Collecting bags, buckets, day pack, digging tools, rock pick, pry bar, eye protection, gloves, trowels, wide brimmed hat, sunglasses, sunscreen, sturdy shoes, newspaper for wrapping fossils,. Drinking water, lunch or snacks.

**Federation News:  
Camp Zzyzx and the Annual CFMS Show**

The California Federation of Mineralogical Societies (CFMS) sponsors week-long Earth Science Studies seminars covering varied lapidary arts: silversmithing, rock carving, cabbing, wirewrapping, and so forth. Also included are field trips. One workshop, Camp Paradise, takes place in northern California in the fall. The second, Zzyzx, takes place in the desert of southern California and is quickly approaching: it takes place March 27-April 3 this year. At our February meeting, I'll have application forms for Zzyzx on the take-one table. The deadline to submit an application is February 27. This is a popular seminar, so if you're interested, sign up soon. The \$350 fee covers costs of the seminars plus rustic camp housing and meals for a full week. It's a bargain, and well worth it according to OGMS members who have participated in the past. Again, look on our take-one table at the February meeting for an application form with further details.

In other Federation news, the annual statewide CFMS Show & Convention takes place May 13-15 in Anderson. That's up in the "far north," near Redding. Show flyers and packets with full info about this show will be on our take-one table at our monthly meetings in February, March, and April. The packets have info on hotels in the area, scheduled events, and exhibitor applications. The statewide show offers an opportunity for either noncompetitive or competitive exhibiting, with trophies for the winning exhibits in a wide variety of categories, from fossils to minerals to educational cases to all the forms of lapidary arts. As CFMS President this year, and in accordance with my presidential CFMS theme of "The Year of the Child," I'll be offering a special prize for the best display by a pebble pup or junior member (under age 18): a \$200 cash prize, a framed certificate, and a mineral or fossil specimen from my personal collection. So if you have kids who might be interested in displaying, encourage them to do so! I'll award the prize to the display I deem to be the best, whether entered as competitive or noncompetitive display. In addition to the show packets on our take-one table at our next meeting, you can get info about the show from the CFMS website: [www.cfmsinc.org](http://www.cfmsinc.org). Finally, the show committee has prepared a map with 7 "self-guided" field trips around Anderson. It's a long way to Anderson, but these statewide shows are always fun and generally feature 3 or 4 times more dealers than you'll typically see at a local club show.
